The last few weeks have been busy with church, family, school, music and income tax. Whew. After so much activity injected into one's life, is there a single verse that distills the "Christian

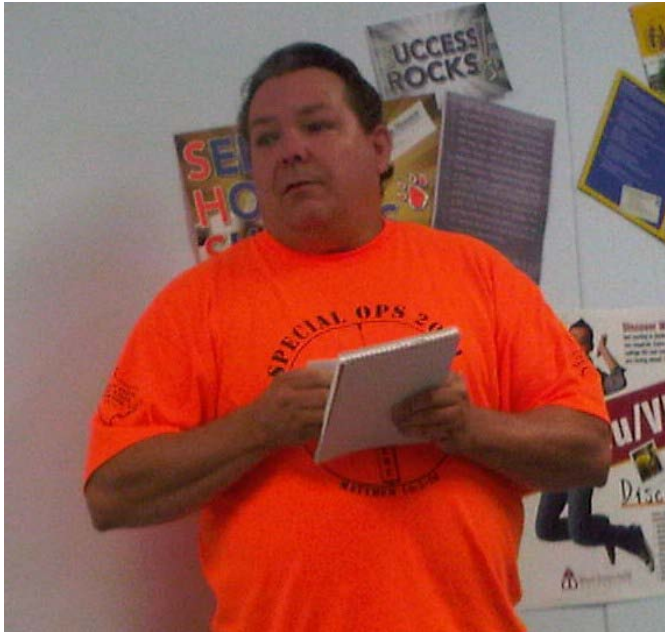

They are new every morning: great is thy faithfulness. Lam. 3:22-23

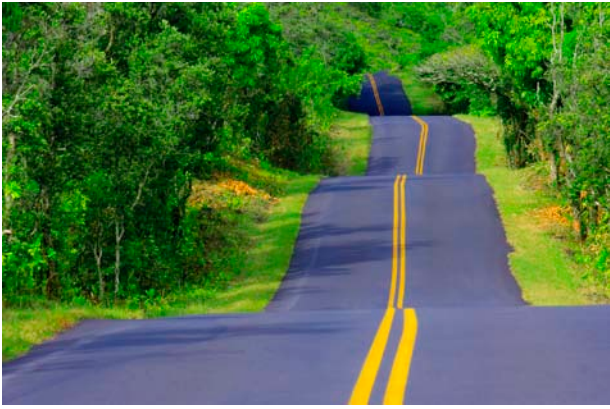

## Road Captains' Corner

### The Importance of Tires to the Rider (Part 2 of 3)

Rubber is harder when it's cold than when warmed up. Motorcycle tires are designed to provide maximum traction at specific temperatures. We would all do well to remember that whenever we ride in cold or hot weather we should ride moderately for a reasonable distance to allow the tires to come up to normal operating temperature. Taking a curve or turn at maximum lean angle may end up with unexpected results. Your motorcycle was designed to work in harmony with a limited selection of tires. **TIP:** The owner's manual is the best source of specifications to use when caring for or replacing them. Tires are specifically designed for use on the front or rear wheel. The front and rear tires should match each other by being from the same brand and model line. Tires must also be mounted so the sidewall arrows correspond to the direction of travel. Where you intend to ride has a bearing on the type of tires that you should be riding on. **TIP:** Never mount a passenger tire on a motorcycle rim: the flat profile of a car tire is incompatible with the dynamics of a vehicle that leans as it corners, and the section of the tire in contact with the rim (the bead) is incompatible with motorcycle rims.

Every street-legal tire sold in the U.S. has a DOT serial number on the sidewall. It begins with DOT and ends with a four-digit date code. 4510 would be week 45 of 2010. Tires made before 2000 have a three digit date code and should never be used. Even if the tire has never been on the ground the rubber will age and possibly have small cracks. **TIP:** Use caution here and err on the safe side by not using tires that have cracks on the sidewalls. The sidewall will also have a code for size, load, and speed index. All street-legal tires are capable of handling the full range of posted speed limits nationwide 93 mph to 130 mph. I think we all agree we should not be riding at speeds within this range!

**TIP:** Tires should be replaced and balanced by a professional. They have the correct tools to prevent damage to the bead which must seat firmly against the rim to provide an airtight seal and to prevent the tire from separating from the rim while riding. Valve stems (and tubes, for tube-type tires) should be replaced every time a tire is replaced. Tires should be balanced with high-speed dynamic balancing to reduce or eliminate wheel vibration.
